The Fruit of the Spirit Is Not Lemons

Yesterday a gentleman phoned to tell me he did not like my sense of humour. "What does laughing have to do with being a Christian?" he asked.

"Is that you, Dad?" I replied, joking.

He was not amused. So I got his address and stuffed a potato in his exhaust pipe. Not really. But the thought did occur to me.

My son Jeffrey seems to think laughter is a good idea. His laugh is contagious. One that spills out of his room, down the street, and even into the church. When he was very small, he took to screaming during a sermon, so I whisked him out the back. As I did, he yelled over my shoulder, "Pray for me!" He's been making us laugh ever since.

I am convinced that few weapons are more important in fighting discouragement and difficulty these days than a good sense of humour. Laughter, stress, and worry cannot co-exist for long. Stress inflates our balloons to the popping point; laughter slowly releases the pressure. Laughter is cholesterol free, contains no MSG, no fat, and no negative side effects. Although it got me into a ton of trouble in fifth grade, laughter never committed a crime or started a war, and there is no record of anyone who died laughing. I have seen laughter disarm, revive, motivate, encourage, and cheer. It is the shortest distance between two people, and one of the few things the government does not yet tax.

But laughter is not always easy to come by, is it? Life is difficult. Times are tough. While speaking at a retreat, I noticed one couple

sitting in the front row at each of my sessions (speakers don't forget such things). The wife was a brilliant and witty woman who laughed at all of my jokes! But her husband merely glared at me. For three days he did this. His lips were puckered. He looked like he'd been sucking rivets off a skateboard. After the final session, his wife approached me with a smile and an extended hand. "I just want to thank you," she said. "I haven't seen my husband laugh this hard in years."

My wife's sister Miriam provides a startling contrast. Miriam suffers from Huntington's disease, a rare genetic disorder causing rapid mental and physical deterioration. Doctors who treat thousands of Huntington's patients are amazed at how slowly this awful disease is growing in her body. The reasons are numerous: a loving husband and family, a positive attitude never ceasing to amaze us, and perhaps most noticeably, an easy laugh. Those who have every reason to cry and yet choose to laugh seem to have a jump-start on life. A doctor told her husband Jim, "Miriam's attitude has reduced the symptoms of Huntington's by 50 per cent."

"It seems your belief in a higher power has helped you," a psychologist said to Miriam and Jim one day. Miriam smiled. "That would be God," she said.

Hers is the laughter of one who has discovered the art of Christian living: giving thanks for what we can see and not complaining about what remains in the dark. At the very core, Miriam knows that she is loved by God, held in His arms, and promised the eternal joys of heaven. She has learned that God gives us enough light for the next faltering step, so she rejoices in the little light she's given, not asking for some great spotlight to take all the shadows away.

For Miriam, laughter has plugged the springs of bitterness, put a permanent cork on tension, and soothed the crippling pain of disappointment. She could be pinned to the mat, but instead she pins this magnet to her fridge: "In the world you will have trouble, but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." Just below it is another one: "If you can't make me thin, make my friends look fat."

Children who see such an attitude are changed forever.

As a humourist, it is my privilege to speak to thousands of people each year. Many are Christian groups; some are not. But I've made a surprising discovery lately—Christians laugh harder. I have seen them fall off benches, ask for oxygen, and hyperventilate. Perhaps the world laughs to forget, but Christians laugh because we remember. We remember that the most serious issues were dealt with at the cross. Death was swallowed up. Eternity was promised. Surely the greatest punchline in all of history is this: that a holy God could love the likes of me. This truth bids me live life with thanksgiving. And sometimes you may see me laughing. It is the laughter of one who deserves the worst and is offered the best. It is the laughter of the forgiven.

Speaking of forgiveness, the next time that gentleman calls about my sense of humour I won't put a potato in his exhaust pipe. But I may consider stuffing fiberglass insulation into his pajamas.

One of my very favorite authors, Frederick Buechner, writes about the way some "religious words" have been so over used that they have lost their impact. Not so with grace he tells us. Even words like gracious and graceful still have some of the bloom left on them.

Some of the preachers I see on TV from time to time assure us that the lives of Christians are problem free. They assure us that if we are a Christian our health will be perfect, our families will be perfect and that we'll have more money than we ever dreamed we would so we can just send it to them. I can't find that in my Bible however. Jesus never said it; the scriptures don't show examples of it and our own experiences show us that it's just not true. What Jesus promised is that He would be with us...good times, hard times, regular times, all the time and that's the most important thing. Buechner says it much better than I do. He says it this way: "The grace of God means something like: Here is your life. You might never have been, but you are because the party wouldn't have been complete without you. Here is the world. Beautiful and terrible things will happen. Don't be afraid. I am with you. Nothing can ever separate us. It's for you that I created the universe. I love you".

So I'm thinking that in 2013 I want to continue to trust God more and more, to seek His will, to remember that He is everywhere, all the time, and that we are in His most powerful and capable hands in this life and forevermore. "Tis grace that's brought me safe thus far and grace will lead me home." Now that's amazing!



well. I have noticed that a lot of my family and friends have been getting sick with the crud lately. If you are one of them I am praying for your speedy recovery. I guess it's just that time of the year. I sit here this month of Lent and I am wondering what it is I can sacrifice this year...maybe you already know what you will give up. I have always admired those of vou who give up chocolate, caffeine, TV or red meat for 40 days...wow, what will power! I have tried and failed many times to do that. I think it is the whole "CAN'T have it for 40 days" thing that makes me crave it even more. Then one year I was saved—my quite intelligent mother-in-law shared with me this statement. She said "Instead of giving something up, add something. Something that will strengthen your relationship with God and do that everyday for 40 days." What a wonderful idea. Well, that sounds easy enough, right? Sure, unless you get the flu! I started off great! I picked a book in the Bible and read a chapter every day. I prayed and studied each morning before work during my 'quiet time'. It was going really well and then the flu hit me, hard. I was soooo sick. I have only had Influenza one time as far as I can remember andlet me just say that there is nothing like it. I was in the bed for an entire week. I had no choice. I couldn't get up and if I did really bad things would happen. So, I couldn't even begin to read my Bible. The lesson may not have taken that particular year, but I did finally get it. Jesus spent 40 days and nights in the wilderness, being tempted and also preparing for his ministry - 40 days preparing....hmmm! Ohhhh, I get it! 40 days being tempted and 40 days to prepare—to prepare for a life time of service to God. This year when you are in the midst of your preparation, try and make it something meaningful, something that you

JANUARY SESSION REPORT

<u>Buildings and Grounds Committee:</u> Jason Howard, Chair and Carlton Smith, Co-Chair. No issues or recommendations. .

<u>Christian Education Committee:</u> Aaron Roberts, Chair. No issues or recommendations.

<u>Fellowship Committee:</u> Doug Richardson, Chair and John Dunn, Co-Chair. No issues or recommendations.

Stewardship Committee: Jim Beisner, Chair. Jim presented the December 2012 financial statement. The church is still on the minus side for available funds but the amount is much less than in November. Jim also distributed the 2012 financial statement which indicated that what was budgeted for the year was not spent.

Jim distributed a time sheet to be used to record volunteer hours for use in the annual missional budget.

A letter from Carolyn Francis requesting a change to a policy on employment eligibility will be reconsidered by the Session. The request will go to Stewardship for a recommendation to be presented at the February Session meeting.

<u>Witness Committee:</u> Judy Simmons, Chair and, Sue Scheer Co-Chair. No issues or recommendations.

<u>Worship Committee:</u> Arlene Lathrop, Chair and, Kim Seal Co-Chair. No issues or recommendations.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Susan reported several people indicated interest in joining SPC after worship on January 13, 2013. Elders will meet at 10:30 am on January 27, 2013 to examine the potential members.

Susan reported on the search for Music Director. Two candidates were interviewed. Susan posted a new advertisement for the Accompanist this week. A decision on the Music Director should take place shortly.

New Business: Jim introduced a motion to establish a separate bank account for Goodness and Groceries. The main reason is to meet accountability standards dictated by organizations providing grants for the mission. 
Stephanie Dunn informed the Session of the need for fundraisers for the church Relay for
