# IT'S ALMOST TIME!





# HISTORY & EFFECTS OF VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Vacation Bible School, or VBS, is a Christian outreach program in which children attend daily activities for about four hours each day for one week during the summer. Vacation Bible School, a summer institution in the Bible belt, focuses not only on evangelism but also on service to others. While the primary goals of Vacation Bible School include teaching children about the Christian faith and missionaries, VBS also allows the hosting church the opportunity to draw in new members to the congregation.

The worldwide effects of Vacation Bible School are significant as children are inspired to contribute time and money to missions work. The curricula used during each VBS week is tailored to teach about an area where the missions work takes place and children are asked to bring items or money to contribute to the focal mission. Some examples are the Safe Water mission, education for girls in the Congo, day care centers in Ecuador, Fill the Backpacks program and buying goats for families on the Baltic peninsula.

The growth and effects of Vacation Bible Schools throughout the world have made an impact on Christian history. Like many efforts to change the world, its growth began with one concerned person and spread with the efforts of many like-minded individuals. Lives have been changed and made better through the missions programs affiliated with Vacation Bible Schools across the United States and throughout the world.





<u>Clerk's Report:</u> Jim, Kim and John reported on the Presbytery meeting held on May 2, 2013

<u>Buildings and Grounds Committee:</u> Jason mentioned the furnace room is prepped to receive the chest freezer and the current ice maker will be discarded. Doug Scott is finding an elevator repairman to do the annual inspection on the elevator.

<u>Christian Education Committee:</u> Aaron discussed a visit to Morrow Presbyterian Church in which he found out their insurance policy allowed only one teacher per classroom. The committee decided to retain two teachers in our classrooms for the future.

Fellowship Committee: John updated the Session on the results of the golf tournament. There were 82 participants and earned around \$7,200.00.

<u>Stewardship Committee:</u> Jim presented the April 2013 financial statement. Jim updated the Session on the Office Manager search. There are 3 candidates to be interviewed next week.

<u>Witness Committee:</u> Sue discussed revisions to the Joseph's Pantry procedures. The committee would like to increase availability of Joseph's Pantry to multiple times during a week with specific times to receive food. Groceries will be pre-bagged so the Office Manager will be able to distribute the food using minimal time out of his/her day. The Session approved the change. Judy reported the committee is moving forward with planning the annual church yard sale.

We have weathered many events together – some wonderful and exciting, and some tragic and heartbreaking. Yet through all the various events and changes, we have experienced the faithfulness of God to His children; and I have seen His faithfulness reflected in your lives day by day. Through the leadership and pastoral changes, your love for God and SPC has remained constant.

Even though I was not an "official" member of SPC, you have opened your hearts and arms to accept me as part of the SPC family.
