



A WORD FROM WARD

The older I get, the more I listen. My son at 37 has become a pretty wise man. He gave me some good advice the other day. First, he said, associate with good people. (They usually won't bring you down.) Second, pay attention. So I am learning from my son.

I have also learned to listen to my choir, my students, and the congregation. As I grow older, I have grown more apt to listen and often actually use suggestions. An example occurred last month when Lynne Jenkins asked me if I was familiar with "The Prayer," by Foster. Curious, I did some research and realized that she was referring to a song that I had sung as a duet with my mom at my niece's wedding some three years ago.
