## WHY WE CHOSE MISSION IMMERSION AT MAXWELL STREET?

Maxwell Street Presbyterian Church is committed to identifying and addressing the needs of those whom Jesus called "the least of these." Toward that end we are involved with a number of social ministries that exist in the community and are constantly at work on creative solutions to the problems that plaque the poor throughout the U.S. The Mission Immersion Project also accomplishes the goal of helping vouth understand the plight facing those who are poor in America. The weeklong experience combines education with implementation. Groups not only hear and discuss social injustices, but work hands-on through mission. Our hope is to instill a desire in the youth to return home and begin or join similar areas of ministry. With hard work comes play, so free time is built into the schedule. Maxwell Street is located on the edge of the University of Kentucky. Basketball courts, a park, and swimming pools are in the neighborhood. One afternoon and evening are set aside for groups to choose a day outing.

ACCOMMODATIONS Housing is provided in a renovated 19th century, air conditioned, three story house located directly behind the church. The second floor is reserved for work camp. Men's and women's restroom facilities with showers are located adjacent to the sleeping quarters. A large kitchen is also located on the 2nd floor.
