Dear Stockbridge family,

By now, you should have received word - by email, on Facebook, and/or from a Session member – that SPC will continue to be s church apart at least through August.

We know that's not what you want to hear, because it's not the news any of us wanted. We long to be together. The time is stretching out and blurring together. Tuesday feels like Thursday, March seems like forever ago but we also can't believe it's already July, and I anticipate July 4th this weekend won't feel like much of holiday but just another day in the long monotony of isolation. Some of us are lonely and bored, others exhausted and overwhelmed, some more calm and others more anxious. But we are in this struggle together.

I am reminded of the Israelites in the wilderness. You'll recall that they spent 40 years between Egypt and the Promised Land. And do you know what they did during that time? It was a time of discomfort and stress, no small amount of griping and complaining, guite a bit of learning and discerning, and a lot of growing together as a community of faith. And do you know what God did during those forty years? God stuck with them. God responded to their complaints with generosity - feeding them with manna and quails, enough for each day. God empowered the people – giving them commandments and faithful leaders and much grace. God taught them about gratitude and hope and patience. And God never, ever left their side. In fact, God was so faithful that the scripture tells us that "The clothes on [their] back did not wear out and [their] feet did not swell these forty years." Think about that and what it tells us about God's faithfulness!

This feels like a wilderness time to me. It's hard, and longer than we would like. We would like to go ahead and be in the Promised Land of whatever the new normal will be. We too know about discomfort and stress, griping and complaining, learning and discerning, and growing together. It's unsettling to be waiting and wandering, through the unknown path of Covid-19 and through the well-worn paths of racism and injustice. We are seeking to be faithful in this time, and we have no road map for how – we're figuring it out, in fits and starts, as we go along.

Your leaders are hard at work coming up with new ways we can connect while apart. We invite your input of what you would like to see and what would keep your proverbial clothes from wearing out and your feet from swelling. I remain ever grateful for your generosity to the church, one another, and the community at large. And most of all, I am grateful for God, who "has brought us thus far on the way" and "keeps us forever in the path, we pray."

Special Meeting - May 17, 2020

Rev. Turner stated the reason for the meeting was to address issues that affect Stockbridge Presbyterian Church caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

Gathering for worship – The Session approved cancelling all activities in the church facilities from 6/1/2020 until 7/1/2020. The Session appointed Arlene Lathrop, Gene Ingram and Stephanie Phillips Ayoola to a task force to develop a plan to reopen SPC. The task force will consist of 5 members. Betsy will contact Jack Shedd, Betsy Sierra, Sue Scheer and Jeffrey Cochran to see if they are interested in filling the remaining 2 positions on the task force. Jim Beisner will act as recorder for the task force and Betsy will act as an advisor.

The Session discussed the financial condition of the church and the April 2020 financial statement.

Jim provided an update on the application for a loan through the Paycheck Protection Program. The church received approval of the loan request and \$24,400 was placed in the general fund on 5/11/2020. The next action will be asking for loan forgiveness once the funds are expended.

Gene provided an update to the repairs to the church facilities that were approved by the Session in February 2020.

Aaron reported on the church's digital presence moving into the phasing in of activities in the future. The Discipleship Committee did not meet but Aaron did some initial research on cost for equipment which he feels will be nominal. The Discipleship Committee will meet and provide an update at the next session meeting.

Session Business - The Session decided to have a called meeting via video conference on Sunday 6/7/2020 at 3:00 pm to discuss additional actions as dictated by the situation concerning coronavirus.

The reason for the meeting having been accomplished, Rev. Betsy Turner closed the meeting with prayer.
